A motion to approve the April 06, 2021 meeting minutes was made by Wayne, seconded by Tim. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Tim, seconded by Bob to approve the Grease Trap Ordinance. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Wayne, seconded by Tim to approve the Police Pension Ordinance. The motion carried.

The Borough office computer system needs to be upgraded, including a firewall and a new computer. A motion was made by Tim, seconded by Shannon to use Pittsburgh Computer Solutions to upgrade the system. The motion carried.

The Borough Building's air conditioning unit had all three compressors go down. The Borough received quotes to repair the system, and also received quotes to install a new system because the unit was almost 20 years old. Hollowood Heating provided the lowest quote to install a new system. A motion was made by Bob, seconded by Wayne for the new unit. The motion carried.

Several Council members and the Mayor had a conversation with Penndot regarding Lincoln Avenue being closed for over a year. Penndot said they do not have the funds to repair the road. Council talked about using the American Rescue Funds (up to \$120,000) to help split the cost so the road can open for

the Borough Residents. Mayor Brown thinks the project is going to cost a lot of money and is not in favor of using the funds for Lincoln Avenue when the funds can be used for other projects. Tim Jansante is concerned for the Residents, as is the rest of Council, and the busses that have to use the side roads. Solicitor Makel sent a letter to Penndot offering to split the cost of repairs up to \$120,000.00. Council is waiting for Penn Dot's response before deciding on further action.

John Petrisek, Attorney for Jeremey and Jamie Chrobak, would like to meet with the Borough, regarding a road problem on Saulters Avenue, HMT and Associates and the Solicitor.

A motion was made by Tim, seconded by Shannon to renew the Borough's Insurance policy with Higbee Insurance. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Tim, seconded by Bob to reappoint Ryan Luko to the Board of Bentleyville Municipal Authority. The motion carried.

Kerry Krider of HMT mentioned we need a new Planning Commission member. Ryan Luko is going to check into this and get back to Council.
