

ORDINANCE NO. 338

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING PERMITS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVATE AND OR BUSINESS DRIVEWAYS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE BOROUGH OF BENTLEYVILLE, WASHINGTON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, WHEN SUCH DRIVEWAYS CONNECTS WITH STREETS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID BOROUGH AND MAINTAINED BY SAID BOROUGH.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, and it is hereby so ordained and enacted as follows:

SECTION 1

From and after the date hereof any individual, partnership, or corporation which shall cause to be constructed any driveway, paved or unpaved which shall connect to any street maintained by the Borough of Bentleyville, said person shall first obtain a permit from the Borough secretary for said construction.

SECTION 2

Said permit shall be issued upon written application to the Borough Secretary and approval by the chairman of the Streets Committee. The application for permit shall set forth the following:

1. The location of said proposed driveway.
2. The nature of said driveway.
3. The length of said driveway, the width of said driveway.
4. The type of surfacing material to be used on said driveway.
5. The method to be utilized to control run off and regulate road drainage.

SECTION 3

Any individual, group of individuals, partnerships, associations, or corporations who violate any provisions of this Ordinance upon conviction thereof in a Summary Proceeding shall be sentenced to pay a fine but not more than \$300.00. In default of payment of this fine and costs, such person or the members of such groups of person, partnerships, associations or corporations shall be liable to imprisonment for not more than thirty days. All fines collected for violation of this Ordinance shall be paid unto the Issuing Authority of Bentleyville.
