

ORDINANCE NO. 95

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LAYING OF A SIDEWALK ON THE EAST AND WEST SIDE OF SECOND AVENUE, BETWEEN WASHINGTON STREET AND SPRING STREET; ON EAST AND WEST SIDE OF BENTLEY AVENUE, BETWEEN WASHINGTON STREET AND SOUTH END OF BENTLEY AVENUE; AND ON THE NORTH AND SOUTH SIDE OF HAZEL STREET, BETWEEN WASHINGTON STREET AND ALICE STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF BENTLEYVILLE, WASHINGTON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

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BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Bentleyville, in the County of Washington and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

SECTION I.

That upon the approval of this ordinance, sidewalks shall be graded for and laid on the East and West side of Second Avenue, between Washington Street and Spring Street; on the East and West side of Bentley Avenue, between Washington Street and South end of Bentley Avenue; and on the North and South side of Hazel Street, between Washington Street and Alice Street, by the owners of property abutting upon the said sidewalks, in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION II.

The sidewalks shall be constructed of concrete laid on a sub-grade, so rolled and tamped as to form a compact uniform surface. The top of the sidewalks on the East and West sides of Second Avenue aforesaid and on the East and West sides of Bentley Avenue aforesaid and on the North side of Hazel Street shall be even with the top of the curb. The top of the sidewalk on the South side of Hazel Street shall be eighteen inches higher than the top of the curb. The surface of said sidewalks shall slope toward the curb with a slope of one-fourth inch to each foot in



width of the sidewalk and the said sidewalks constructed to a width of four feet and shall be constructed a distance of eighteen inches from the curb.

#### SECTION III.

The sidewalks shall consist of a solid slab of concrete, composed of one part First Class Portland Cement, two parts clean river sand and four parts clean screened gravel or broken limestone or slag, thoroughly mixed. This mixture shall be spread upon the sub-grade, thoroughly tamped and floated until the surface is smooth and shall have a uniform thickness of not less than four (4) inches. All work and materials to be approved by the Street Committee of Council.

#### SECTION IV.

That immediately upon the adoption of the ordinance, the borough clerk shall give notice to all parties or persons owning property abutting upon the said streets, within the limits above mentioned, to grade for and lay the sidewalk in front of such property so owned by them in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance within sixty (60) days from the date of such notice and it shall be the duty of all such owners of property to grade for and lay the sidewalk in front of their property so owned by them respectively, abutting on the portion of said Second Avenue, Bentley Avenue and Hazel Street above designated and to complete the same within sixty days from the receipt of such notice.

#### SECTION V.

In case any property owners or occupiers shall violate the provisions of this ordinance or fail to grade for, lay or relay or cause to be graded for, laid or relaid, the sidewalk in accordance with the provisions hereof, within sixty days from the date of notice as above provided, it shall be the duty of the Street Committee to cause such sidewalk to be graded for, laid or relaid in accordance with the requirements of this ordinance



and the cost of the work and materials of such grading, laying or relaying, with ten per centum advance, shall be collected from the defaulting lot owner, as provided by the Acts of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in such case made and provided.

SECTION VI.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
